

GENERAL REGULATION ORDINANCE NO. 15

A GENERAL REGULATION ORDINANCE OF THE MIDWAY CITY SANITARY DISTRICT, OF ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, REGULATING THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE WITHIN THE MIDWAY CITY SANITARY DISTRICT; PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF; AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND MOTIONS INCONSISTENT HEREWITH TO THE EXTENT OF SUCH INCONSISTENCY.

THE GOVERNING BOARD of the MIDWAY CITY SANITARY DISTRICT, of Orange County, California, does ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1: Definitions.

A. "Garbage" Defined. For the purposes of this ordinance, the term "garbage" shall include all animal and vegetable refuse from kitchens, all vegetable and fruit trimmings, including such refuse from vegetable and fruit stands, cafes, restaurants, grocery stores and other similar establishments, and all other refuse that shall have been prepared for or intended for food, or shall have resulted from the preparation of food.

B. "Refuse" Defined. For the purposes of this ordinance, the term "refuse" shall include all garbage, debris, salvage and other waste or discarded matter.

Section 2: Collection of Refuse. The Midway City Sanitary District shall collect refuse from all homes, and all commercial or industrial establishments within said District for which such service is requested at no charge to the owners or operators thereof, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter specified; PROVIDED that nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to prevent any person from operating a commercial trash disposal service within said District.

Section 3: Schedule of Service. Subject to the direction of the Board of Directors, the Refuse Supervisor shall determine from time to time the schedules of refuse collection service to be provided for residential and commercial or industrial establishments throughout the District. Upon such determination, a written notice of such schedule shall be given to each person affected thereby, indicating such schedule of collection service.

Section 4: Containers. Except as provided hereafter, all refuse shall be placed in containers not to exceed twenty-four (24) inches in diameter and not exceeding forty-five (45) gallons in volume. The preferable substance of such container shall be metal and the District shall not be responsible for damage to containers.

Section 5: Prohibited Substances. No refuse shall be collected which consists of dead animals, dirt, earth, sod, feces, excrement, manure, plaster, sand, rock, gravel, broken concrete, or similar items.

Section 6: Size and Weight Limitations. No container or object in excess of fifty (50) pounds shall be placed for collection by the District. Furniture, boxes, crates, etc., shall be broken down into sections not to exceed two (2) feet in width and four and one-half (4 1/2) feet in length. Tree and shrub trimmings, sticks, papers, magazines and similar items may be tied in small bundles not exceeding the size and weight limits hereof in lieu of being placed in containers.

Section 7: Ashes and Garbage. Ashes placed for collection shall be in separate, expendable containers which shall not be returned. Garbage placed for collection shall be drained of all liquid and shall be wrapped with at least three thicknesses of paper.

Section 8: Placement and Removal of Containers. Except as provided

hereafter, all containers, bundles and items for collection shall be deposited on the parkway or curb in front of the property or at such other place as the Refuse Supervisor may direct prior to ^{*6:00}~~7:00~~ o'clock a.m., on the day scheduled for collection, and the emptied containers and all uncollected items shall be removed to a place not visible from the public street not later than 12:00 o'clock Noon on the day following such collection.

Section 9: Use of Bins. Whenever, in the opinion of the Refuse Super-

visor, it is convenient and necessary to the proper administration of this ordinance, he may require any person requesting service to utilize the refuse bin service provided by the District. Upon such requirement, the person requesting such service shall deposit with the District the sum of ~~(\$90.00)~~ ^{by council order changed to \$105} as a security ^{5/21/69} deposit on each bin to be provided. Upon termination of refuse collection service ^{130 5/2/73 & 200X} and return of the bin in satisfactory condition, the amount of ~~\$75.00~~ ^{90.00} shall be ^{\$125} refunded to such applicant. All such bins shall be located on private property at a place satisfactory to the Refuse Supervisor.

Section 10: Tags. Upon the placement for collection of any refuse or

container not complying with the provisions of this ordinance, the collector shall place, or cause to be placed, upon such refuse or container a red tag indicating the respect in which said refuse or container violates the provisions hereof and such refuse shall not be collected until and unless such violation has been corrected.

Section 11: Penalty for Violation. Every person violating, failing,


neglecting or refusing to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment for not to exceed one

(1) month, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and each person shall be guilty of a separate offense for each day during which a violation of or failure, neglect or refusal to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance is committed, continued or permitted by such person.

Section 12: Repeal. That all ordinances, resolutions and motions, and parts thereof, inconsistent herewith be and the same hereby are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency and no further.


